[UON FEBE Scholarship for Excellence in Year 12](#)

Value: \$30,000 AUD

Open/Closing Dates: April 1, 2020 – January 8, 2021

This scholarship was established in 2015 to encourage and support exceptional students to commence their studies with the Faculty of Engineering and Built Environment.

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship you must meet the following criteria:

- Be commencing in an undergraduate program within the Faculty of Engineering and Built Environment, University of Newcastle.
- Have a minimum ATAR of 98.5, with adjustment factors NOT included.
- Have completed a Year 12 Higher School Certificate in the year prior to commencement of the undergraduate program.
- Be enrolled full-time.
- Be enrolled at Callaghan Campus.
- Be an Australian citizen, Australian Permanent Resident or New Zealand Citizen.

Applications are not submitted for this scholarship. Scholarships are automatically awarded in Semester 1 and Semester 2 following admissions intake.

The Vice-Chancellor's Leadership Scholarship (VCLS) aims to reward the success and accomplishments of high-achieving secondary school students who demonstrate excellence not only in their academic studies, but also in other aspects of their lives. Additionally, these scholarship holders are offered access to The Academy which helps to optimise their academic and leadership potential.

Applicants must:

- be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia
- reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in [Western Sydney](#)

- provide evidence of leadership and community involvement (e.g. School Captain, community service, sport, the arts, public speaking, Maths/Science Olympiads, Duke of Edinburgh award, etc.)

Macquarie Alumni First in Family Scholarship

Value: \$5,000 AUD

Open/Closing Dates: August 14, 2020 – January 8, 2021

The Macquarie University First in Family Scholarship is available to support students who are the first of their immediate family (parent, sibling or grandparent) to attend University. It is awarded to a new undergraduate student in any discipline.

The successful applicants for this scholarship will be able to demonstrate:

- Academic merit
- That they are a Domestic student
- That they are a current school leaver. Students who have taken a gap year are also eligible
- Commitment to community service and extra-curricular activities
- Leadership qualities or leadership potential
- Commitment to study
- Financial and other disadvantages are also considered
- That they are the first of their immediate family (parent, sibling or grandparent) to receive a qualification from a university in Australia or overseas

- Meet ongoing eligibility criteria, including satisfactory academic progress prior to receiving future payment.

AVCAT Scholarships

Value: \$4,000 AUD

Open/Closing Dates: August 18, 2020 – October 31, 2020

AVCAT is a national charity providing tertiary education scholarships and bursaries to children and grandchildren of ex-serving veterans. We assist scholars each year to reach their potential through achieving a range of academic and personal goals.

Eligibility for a scholarship include the following:

- Australian residency status
- Planning to enrol or enrolled in an undergraduate degree in Australia of one or more academic year's duration in a university, TAFE college or registered training organisation
- Be studying or planning to study full time online or face to face. Priority is given to those who have not previously undertaken tertiary education
- Applicants who are seeking a scholarship for a second degree, Masters or Doctorate degrees may be considered for a scholarship but will be treated as a lower priority. If an applicant has received a Long Tan Bursary, they cannot be considered for another Long Tan Bursary.
- In receipt of or eligible to receive Centrelink payments including Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY, Austudy or an accepted government payment.
- Be a child or a grandchild as defined by AVCATs Constitution (adopted children, foster children, stepchildren and grandchildren). Stepchildren and foster children must have resided with or been financially supported by their veteran stepparent for 5 of the last 10 years.
- The veteran must be an Australian ex-serving veteran with operational service including eligible war service, war-like service and peacekeeping/peacemaking service OR 3 or more continuous years of full-time other service, as a member of the Australia Navy, Army or Air Force.
- People who are serving in the Reserve Forces are considered to be serving so the applicant is not eligible.
